**Thin Score:* 1) AWT carries the strongest, thinnest condoms on the market, so even our thickest condoms are often thinner than most widely available condoms. Therefore, don't necessarily avoid a '4', as it may have other redeeming features that will meet your pleasure needs.

***Thin Score:* 2) Thicker condoms may seem stronger, but studies show that they are not when looking only at thickness. What makes a stronger condom is the manner in which they are manufactured and tested, so very thin--and well made--condoms are safer for your use, and more pleasurable for use. Choose a condom based on the overall features, not simply the thickness/thinness score. (And never wear two condoms "for safety's sake"--two are NOT safer than one good, lubed condom.)

Flat width and length: All of these condoms were measured at collapsed flat states to standardize the comparisons. However, FLAT WIDTH is larger than the actual diameter, so these "widths" are larger than the penis wearing them. As a general rule, latex condoms will stretch more than polyurethane, but often condoms are more comfortable when worn just slightly stretched, rather than taughly stretched. This means that choosing a condom that "fits snugly and comfortably" will function better in safety and pleasure than one worn too snugly.

Contoured: Some enjoy the sensation of a condom which hugs the penis, either because it increases the sensation for the person wearing it, or because it reduces the friction for the person being penetrated. The "head pouch" shape allows more latex movement (and sensation) around the head of the penis, which may vastly increase the pleasure of the wearer. Too much "head pouch" latex may increase friction uncomfortably for the person being penetrated, so testing is definitely advised
